## What is the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC)?

A Regional Council of Government established under Chapter 167 of the Ohio Revised Code and a Metropolitan County Criminal Justice Services Agency established under ORC Section 181.54 (subsequently amended to 5502.64).

## Mission Statement

To promote and foster cooperation and coordination between separate governmental units and agencies, and to improve the criminal justice system through planning, analysis, technical assistance, training, information management, and such other services as requested by the governmental units served.

## What is the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC)?

The CJCC is a thirteen member board comprised of criminal justice representatives, elected officials and citizen representatives. The Mayor of the City of Toledo and Lucas County Commissioners each appoint six members, five of whom are mandatory due to the position they hold. The sixth appointment from each jurisdiction is an appointed citizen. The thirteenth member is appointed by the CJCC and is the chief of a suburban law enforcement agency.

## The federal government provided funding

to initiate and maintain comprehensive criminal justice planning at the local level. As a result, Criminal Justice Supervisory Council Established (CJSC) was established.

## CJCC - History

The City of Toledo and the Lucas County
Board of Commissioners signed an agreement
to create the Criminal Justice Coordinating
Council (CJCC) as successor to the CJSC. The
CJCC was established as a separate entity under
Ohio Revised Code 167.01-08 and 181.54
(subsequently amended to 5502.64) to provide
planning, analysis, training, information
management and technical assistance.

The CJCC Reentry Committee was formed.

CJCC subsequently joined the National
Network of Criminal Justice Coordinating
Councils; a forum to engage in national
problem-sharing and problem-solving
discussions about creating systemic and
sustainable change.

The CCJC was engaged to support the Lucas County Safety + Justice Challenge (SJC).

The Criminal Justice Training and Education
Center (CJTEC) was created to provide basic,
in-service and
management-level training to criminal justice
personnel in Northwest Ohio. A second
valuable resource became available to police,
courts and corrections agencies with the
creation of the Northwest Ohio Regional

Information System (NORIS), a

computerized information system.

Due to declining contract revenue, CJTEC was discontinued. Mainframe Core Software migrated from Unisys to PC client server utilizing SQL server databases



## CJCC CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL

#### **Established Purpose Areas:**


- To establish a legal organization that will be authorized to receive federal, state, and local monies in order to improve the criminal justice system.
- To implement and maintain a criminal justice information system.
- To perform any duty, or exercise any power, as allowed under Sections 167 and 5502.64 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- To receive and/or encourage and stimulate gifts, endowments, and bequests. 5502.64 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- To apply for and accept grants and/or loans from governmental agencies, foundations, and charitable institutions.
- To purchase or otherwise acquire, lease, invest in, hold, use, encumber, sell, exchange, transfer, and dispose of property of any description or any interest therein. If the CJCC performs such action on behalf of only one of its governmental units, it will follow the statutory or charter procedures applicable to that governmental unit so far as possible in taking such action, otherwise it will follow the statutory procedures applicable to counties so far as possible in taking such actions.
- Upon the dissolution of the CJCC, assets will be distributed to either an organization that will become responsible for one or more of the functions of the CJCC at the time of its dissolution, or divided among the current membership.



- Founded in 1974
- 2018 budget = \$3,347,382 (CJCC budget = \$4,133,212)
- Provides records automation and information sharing among jurisdictions
- Staffing 38 employees providing network/hardware support and application development/enhancement
- 100,000,000 automated criminal justice records
- Eight million entries, queries, and updates annually
- 100,000+ active warrants
- 7,000,000+ criminal histories
- 12 million transactions per month
- 2,800 users
- 134 member agencies (Lucas County and Northwest Ohio)

## Data Integration


- NORIS is a highly integrated criminal justice information system.
- The system links law enforcement, courts, probation, corrections, and related criminal justice applications through a Regional Identifier (RID).
- RID is a person-based ID allowing information sharing among agencies and applications supporting the automation of many routine processes.
- Integrating information allows the user to track an offender's progress throughout the entire criminal justice system.






